Insights from Ground Reality"

Shirsha is a development sector professional with seven years of experience. She has completed her schooling from Loreto Day School, Sealdah, and obtained her Bachelor's degree in Sociology from CU in 2013, followed by a Masters from RBU. Her professional journey began when she joined CNI in 2015.

Over the last few years she has gained diverse experience in various domains including education, protection, health and nutrition. Her work primarily focuses on supporting marginalized communities in West Bengal. She directly engages target groups such as adolescents, children, pregnant women and lactating mothers. She also collaborates with stakeholders from local self-governments and the Women and Child Development Department and the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. Her work addresses public health challenges such as anemia, teenage pregnancy, and early and forced marriages. She works closely with adolescents, providing guidance and information during the transitional ages of 10-19. Her training sessions cover topics like Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights, Life-Skill Education, Effective Communication and Leadership.

This series aims to bring professionals and practitioners of Sociology and other Social Sciences, working in diverse fields, to a common platform, to offer much-needed insight into what lies beyond formal academic training.
