OBJECTIVE OF THE SEMINAR:

The seminar was organised with the objective of spreading the essence of brotherhood, communal harmony and inclusivity among the students as exemplified by our Indian Culture.

Mr. Khokan Saikh, Assistant Professor, Department of History, GGDC, Mangalkote

PROCEEDINGS OF THE SEMINAR:

The speaker began his talk with the reference of V.A. Smith who had once called India an "Ethnological Museum". He then stated that variety in India springs from differences in culture and modes of life in different parts of India. He then drew the reference of Dr. Radha Kumud Mookerjee and his quote - "India is a museum of cults and customs, creeds and culture, faith and tongues, racial types and social system." He pointed out that these differences have failed to fragment India mainly due to the basic unity of literary ideas, philosophy and conventions outlook upon life through the country. He said that cultural unity and homogeneity is reflected in the social ceremonies and religious rites, festival and modes of life which are the same in both in the North and the South. He then referred to the sanctity of a family, the rules of the castes, the *sanskaras*, the rite of cremating a body, the cleanliness of kitchen etc., are common to all the communities and sects. The concept of 'Unity in Diversity' across India is deeproted in its various festivals such as Rakshabandhana, Diwali, Holi and others in which everyone participates as an individual breaking down the barriers of caste, creed, race and religion. The speaker finally concluded by describing how these differences and unity go hand-in-hand making India a unique country on its own.


