#### **OBJECTIVE OF THE SEMINAR:**

The seminar was aimed at making the students aware about the history of the origin of Bengali language which forms an important part of the Indian Knowledge System. It was also meant to introduce the students to the rich Indian culture and heritage.

Prof. Koushik Kumar Dutta, Assistant Professor, Department of Bengali, GGDC, Mangalkote

#### **PROCEEDINGS OF THE SEMINAR:**

The seminar began with the speaker addressing Bengali language as a member of the Indo-Aryan group of languages having connections with the Indo-European group and being influenced by different language families in South Asia. He then referred to Bengali language as the seventh most popular language spoken across the globe. Talking about is history, he elaborated how the three Indian languages - Oriya, Assamese and Bengali formed a single branch. Oriya was the first to split off from it followed by Assamese. This has led to several early Bengali literary works like the Charyapadas being claimed by the Oriya and Assamese as their own works. He further presented how the Bengali linguists describe Bengali language to have originated from Pali and currently spoken in West Bengal, Tripura, parts of Jharkhand and Assam and Andaman and Nicobar Islands in India. It is also spoken in Bangladesh. Then he referred to the research works of some eminent persons in this field, Sukumar Sen and Suniti Kumar Chatterji who traced the origin of Bengali language back to the 10<sup>th</sup> century being heavily derived from Magahi Prakrit and Magahi Apabhramsha. He also mentioned how the South Asian languages such as Dravidian, Austroasiatic, and Tibeto-Burman language families helped to increase the vocabulary of Bengali language. Finally, he concluded by telling about the variations in Bengali language found in different regions of West Bengal and how they came into existence.
