The seminar was aimed to discuss about the vanishing folk tales of Bengal in this era of globalization and boom in social media providing easy access to addictive audio-visual entertainment. It was meant to make the students aware about the rich culture and heritage of Bengal which has a prominent place in the 'Indian Knowledge System'.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE SEMINAR:

The speaker began his lecture by describing the meaning of folk tales, the essence they carry and how they have been transmitted down the generation mostly through word-of-mouth. He then stressed on the issues of rapidly vanishing interest in folk tales and the need for their preservation. He then gave some names of researchers in this field who have been working continuously towards collection, documentation and preservation of folk tales from different corners of Bengal. Speaking of their importance, he highlighted how folk tales speak of the cultural beliefs, the socio-political conditions and the economic strata in the society in the pre-historic times and their evolutionary trajectories as science and civilization took control of humankind. He also highlighted how folk tales have contributed to the enrichment of Bengali literature and how they talk of pre-historic times. At times, folktales also talk about certain rituals which can no longer be observed today. In a subtle manner, they also talk about social, gender and environmental issues. These were elaborated by the speaker.
